FAITH NOT SHIPWRECKED ACTS 27

How did you see God working in your life this week? (Romans 1:11, 12)

GOD'S FAITHFULNESS—"God did not promise smooth sailing along the way. As we serve Christ, there will be storms, hardships, high seas, breakdowns—but also peace, assurance, fruitfulness, the sustaining presence of God." Kent Hughes, Acts, page 333. (Acts 27:21-26, Matthew 14:22-33, fn 14:30, 31, John 14:18, 26, 27, fn 14:27, Hebrew 13:5, John 10:27-29, fn 10:28, 29) How could your relationship with Jesus sustain you in a life or death struggle?

GOD DELIVERANCE—"Paul's faith did not save him from the storm. His faith carried him through the storm. "We are often *objective*-oriented, but God is *process*-oriented. We just want to get to Rome, but God is even more interested in *how* we get there." Hughes, page 338. (Acts 27:30-38, 42-44, II Corinthians 1:6-11, fn 1:6,7, fn 1:8-10[1st], fn 1:8-10[2nd], II Corinthians 11:23-12:10, fn 11:23-29) How was God's grace shown in Acts 27?
