THE FINAL KEY

ACTS 10:9-20

How did you see God working in your life this week? (Romans 1:11, 12)

BACKGROUND: Read Matthew 16:13-19. According to Acts 1:8, the gospel is to go first to the Jews (Acts 2:1-5), second to the Samarians (Acts 8:14-17, fn 8:15-17), and now to the Gentiles (Acts 10).

TO OPEN God's salvation's biggest door. Redemption is for everyone; and the sheet includes all kinds of people—people that are easy to love and people that we might naturally detest. Since God loves them, so must we. (Acts 10:9-14, fn 10:12, John 3:16, fn 3:16[1st], Romans 5:8, fn 5:8, Titus 2:11) When sharing the message of salvation, why is it important for you to share instead of relegating?

TO STOP promoting religious restrictions and customs, thereby making salvation difficult. (Acts 10:15, 16, Galatians 5:2-6, fn 5:3, 4, fn 5:6, Ephesians 2:11-18, fn 2:11-16) What prevents you from leading people to Christ?

TO GO—God's heart and His desire is for all people in all nations to be saved. "I like C.S. Lewis's statement: 'Next to the blessed sacrament, your neighbor is the holiest object presented to your senses.'" Kent Hughes, <u>Acts</u>, p. 147 (**Acts 10:17-20**, **Acts 1:8**, **fn 1:8**[4th], I Timothy 2:4, fn 2:4, II Peter 3:8, 9, fn 3:8, 9, II Timothy 4:5)

Suggestion: Ask God to give you names of people with whom He wants you to share the gospel.
